**Day 1 - March 19, 2026**

**Private | Transfer from airport to hotel - Night | Bilingual assistance included.**

**Day 2 - March 20, 2026**

**Private | Half Day City tour Lima and Larco Museum.** Duration: 5 hrs

Today we will learn about the two characters of Lima: the modern one, reflected in the districts of Miraflores and San Isidro; and the historic one, encapsulated in its historic center declared a World Cultural Heritage by UNESCO. Along the tour through different districts of the city, we will see how the old and the modern coexist in buildings such as the Museum of Italian Art, Palace of Justice, Museum of Lima, Plaza San Martín, among others. We will discover the center of Lima on foot, having the Main Square as the focal point: a beautiful colonial square worthy of photography, surrounded by emblematic buildings such as the Government Palace, the Cathedral and the Archbishop's Palace. We will have the opportunity to enter one of the most iconic ecclesiastical spaces in Lima, the Convent of Santo Domingo, also declared Cultural Heritage of Humanity and where the relics of three Peruvian saints are found: Santa Rosa de Lima, San Martín de Porres, and San Juan Macías. The tour would not be complete without a visit to the Rafael Larco Herrera Museum, one of the most important in the country, exhibiting a valuable collection of almost 45,000 pieces of pre-Hispanic cultures, especially the Mochicas. This museum stands out for being one of the first in the world to have visitable storerooms and to provide virtual access to its entire collection. We will marvel at the quality of its pieces of jewelry, textiles and its enigmatic erotic room, dedicated to ceramics alluding to fertility.

#### **Private | Ancient roots of Lima at Huaca Pucllana by night – including dinner**

We will be dazzled by the nocturnal beauty offered by the most important pre-Hispanic archaeological site in Lima: the Huaca Pucllana. This archaeological jewel located in the middle of the city not only stands out for its impressive pyramidal construction made of almost seven stories of adobe, but also for becoming an important ceremonial and administrative center of the Lima culture between the years 200 and 700 AD. Guided by experts, we will tour its different fronts, surrounded by the modern buildings of Miraflores, one of the most important tourist spots in today's Lima, a sample of how the past and the present coexist harmoniously in the City of Kings.

We will culminate the visit with a delicious dinner in one of the most acclaimed restaurants in the city with an enviable view of the Huaca Pucllana and its fantastic lighting that will surround us in a charming atmosphere.

### **Day 3 - March 21, 2026**

#### **Private | Transfer from hotel to airport - Day | Bilingual assistance included.**

At the scheduled time, a representative will accompany us during the transfer from the hotel to the airport.

#### **Private | Transfer from Cusco airport to Sacred Valley hotel - Day | Bilingual assistance included.**

Upon our arrival at the destination, a representative will transfer us from the airport to the nearby Sacred Valley. Staying in this lower-lying area will help you acclimatize to the high altitude.

#### **Private | Half Day Pisac market.**

In this half day tour, we will focus on the handicrafts of the Sacred Valley of the Incas and the people who strive every day to keep this tradition alive. We will visit Awanakancha, a living Andean Museum where we can learn everything about the textile art of the area: the domestication process, care of camelids such as llamas and alpacas to obtain their wool, the ingredients used to dye the fibers and the techniques used to work the fabrics. In addition to learning about the history of this ancient art, we will be able to see how artisans work their looms. There we can also visit the craft store and make some purchases. On the way to Pisac, we will stop at the Taray viewpoint, from where we can get a stunning panoramic view of the valley. We will appreciate the Urubamba riverbed, the mountains that surround it and the villages that give it life. This will be the ideal place to take beautiful pictures of the valley and its nature. We will arrive to Pisac, a traditional town characterized by its quiet streets and its market where it proudly lives its millenary heritage represented in its textile art, ceramics, jewelry pieces and other handicrafts.

**Day 4 - March 22, 2026**

**Private | Full Day Maras, Moray and Ollantaytambo.** Duration: 7 hours

Today, we will learn about the tradition and history of the Sacred Valley, the traces left by its ancient inhabitants, and the culture of its current towns. Beginning at the Raqchi viewpoint, we will have a spectacular view of the valley before going down to explore it. From the top, we will have a majestic view of the ancient Maras salt mines, where the coveted Maras salt - one of the finest in the world - is collected. We will see almost 3,000 pools that in Inca times were an important center for the imperial economy. Today, it continues to be a valuable source of income for hundreds of families. With stunning panoramic views of the mosaic of terraces and ponds, Maras offers the perfect setting for photography enthusiasts. We will also arrive at the Moray archaeological site, which resembles a natural amphitheater. During the Tahuantinsuyo, it functioned as a laboratory and agricultural research center, according to some studies. Its enormous concentric terraces and the variety of microclimates they created allowed the growth of a variety of crops. We will continue to Ollantaytambo, an ancient military, religious, and agricultural center of the Incas. Strategically located on a mountain, its imposing fortress is a sample of all the Inca power. We will visit the main temple, terraces, and fountains, while we enjoy an unbeatable view of the town, the only one that maintains the original Inca urban design and which we can also visit to see its stone streets, its market and breathe the spirit of the Andes.

One of the most important tourist landmarks in the world awaits us: Machu Picchu! From there, we will explore the ancient ruins, learning all about the history and mysteries that this mystical and impressive place holds. Surrounded by incomparable landscapes, there will be no shortage of spectacular photo opportunities with the iconic Huayna Picchu as a backdrop! Once we have recharged ourselves with the magical energy of Machu Picchu, we will return to Aguas Calientes where we will have free time to have lunch and relax in our hotel.
